President's Corner

Dear Members and Friends of the Brandy Station Foundation,

First, on behalf of the Board of the Brandy Station Foundation, I would like to thank you for your support over the last year. I would also like to thank our guest speakers, exhibitors, re-enactors, tour guides, greeters, and visitors who came from near and far to make 2023 a very successful year.

As we look to the future, I am excited about our plans for 2024. We are busy planning a robust schedule of events and activities for the coming year. Specifically, we are planning to expand the number of weekends that the Graffiti House is open, increase the number of guest speakers, double the number of activities on the grounds of the Graffiti House, and engage our visitors in more interactive activities.

In 2002, the Brandy Station Foundation purchased the Graffiti House, the two-story structure located at 19484 Brandy Road in Brandy Station. The Civil War-era Graffiti House is listed on the National Register of Historic Places. The walls, primarily on the second floor, contain drawings, messages, and signatures of Civil War soldiers, both Union and Confederate, hence the name "Graffiti House." A museum is on the first floor of the building. We are proud to be a foundation that promotes the Graffiti House as a neutral witness to history.

The Graffiti House is the centerpiece of many of our activities. Over the last year, we have taken steps to address the deteriorating condition of the siding by getting proposals to repair and replace the siding and paint the exterior of the Graffiti House. In addition, we have gotten proposals to make improvements and secure the exterior wall of the foundation. We are also looking to improve the experience of our visitors while touring the exhibits on the first floor and graffiti on the second floor of the Graffiti House. We invited a curator to give us recommendations on improving the displays, signage, and layout of the first floor. Additionally, we are exploring ways to make the graffiti on the second floor more accessible to people with disabilities through the use of audiovisual technology. Finally, we are exploring options to further mitigate the risk of vandalism to the graffiti on the second floor.

We believe that the before mentioned improvements will greatly improve both the appearance and structural integrity of the 1858 Graffiti House. In addition, we believe that many of the recommended changes on the second floor with the historic Civil War graffiti and the exhibits on the first floor will greatly enhance the experience of our visitors.

We are asking you to assist us with making significant improvements to the Graffiti House. We have sought and received some funding from the Culpeper County

Board of Supervisors and the Northern Piedmont Community Foundation. Our goal is to raise an additional \$17,000 to fund the exterior painting of the Graffiti House. We ask that you make a special donation to the Brandy Station Foundation's Graffiti House Exterior Painting Project. For your convenience we have enclosed a donation form. We hope that you favorably respond to this special request for help.
