
Additional Graffiti Uncovered during Recent Preservation Work by Christopher Mills

The Brandy Station Foundation was fortunate to have conservator Christopher Mills (Christopher Mills Conservation Services, LLC www.chrismillsconservation.com) back in January to work on plaster stabilization and uncovering more graffiti. In the photograph above is clearly seen the words: "Battle of Kelly's Ford" This ties in with the Maryland scroll

containing the names of the men in Breathed's Battery who signed the wall on the day before the battle: March 16, 1863.




Close-up of graffiti with Battle of Kelly's Ford and Battle of Gettysburg, July 2-3, 1863

In smaller script behind the Battle of Kelly's' Ford has been uncovered this: Battle of Gettysburg, July 2-3, 1863 The Rebs got licked.

Other new graffiti uncovered is a reference to the Battle of Brandy Station: "Beauford vs. Jones"; we think that this is a phonetic spelling of Buford vs. Jones. Brig. Gen. John Buford clashed with Confederate Brig. Gen. William E. "Grumble" Jones during the Battle of Brandy Station. About 4:30 a.m. on June 9th, 1863, Brigadier General John Buford's column of 5,500 soldiers splashed across the fog-shrouded Rappahannock River surprising the Confederate pickets at Beverly's Ford. Nearby Southern horsemen from Brigadier General William "Grumble" Jones' brigade, awakened by the sound of gunfire, rode into the fray partially dressed and often riding bareback. They struck Buford's leading brigade, commanded by Colonel Benjamin F. "Grimes" Davis, near a bend in the Beverly's Ford Road and temporarily checked its progress. In the fighting Davis was killed. Davis' brigade had been stopped just short of where the Confederate Horse Artillery was camped and was

vulnerable to capture. Also, a kind of laundry list was uncovered: 3 undershirts, 1 overshirt, 2 pair drawers, and 3 [ditto mark for pair] hose. The name H.D. Specht was uncovered; we think it is Henry D. Specht, Company G, 6th Regiment, Pennsylvania Reserve Volunteers (below). Additional names have been uncovered and some uncovered graffiti has yet to be deciphered.

Graffiti House Featured in an Episode of "The R.I.P. Files"

An episode featuring paranormal activity at the Graffiti House was one of two episodes on a DVD that has been sent to the Brandy Station Foundation. The BSF is presenting a series of two-hour tours, one devoted to each of the four engagements that comprise the Battle of Brandy Station on June 9, 1863. Transportation: Personal vehicle caravan will depart from the Graffiti House at 10AM. The cost is \$10 (children under 12 are free). Tours leave from the Graffiti House at 10:00 am and last 2 hours. No reservations are needed, please arrive at the Graffiti House before ten. Special tours for individuals or groups on other days can be specially arranged.

Beverly Ford & St. James Church (April 7, June 2, July 28)

Kelly's Ford & Stevensburg (April 21, June 30, Aug 11)

Fleetwood Hill (May 5, June 30, Aug 25)

Beverly Ford & St. James Church – April 7, June 2, July 28

The first tour in the series covers the early morning fighting between troops under the command of Union General John Buford and those commanded by his West Point classmate, Confederate General William E. "Grumble" Jones. Incidents examined include the death of Union Colonel Benjamin Franklin Davis in a one-on-one encounter with a Confederate lieutenant on the Beverly Ford Road, and the charge of the 6th Pennsylvania Cavalry against Confederate artillery at Saint James Church.

Kelly's Ford & Stevensburg – April 21, June 30, Aug 11

The second tour in the series begins with a discussion of the Union river-crossing at Kelly's Ford, and then follows the route of march of the Union cavalry division commanded by Colonel Alfred Napoleon Duffie, a deserter from the French army, to Stevensburg. The fighting at Stevensburg, a neglected aspect of the Battle of Brandy Station, is presented in detail. This tour concludes with a description of the mortal wounding of Captain William Farley, JEB Stuart's volunteer aide de camp.

Fleetwood Hill – May 5, June 30, Aug 25

The third tour focuses on the fighting for Fleetwood Hill, the most intense and prolonged combat on June 9, 1863. At one point 12 regiments -- 6 Union and 6 Confederate -- struggled for control of the hilltop. Unlike most Civil War battles, the troopers fought from the saddle, mostly with sabers. One frustrated Rebel was heard to shout at his Yankee

opponent, "Why don't you Yankees put away your sabers, draw your pistols, and fight like gentlemen!"

Buford Knoll & Yew Ridge – May 19, July 14, Sept 8

The final installment in the series of tours presents the fighting that took place later in the afternoon of June 9 between General Buford and General W.H.F. "Rooney" Lee's brigade. During the fighting, Rooney Lee, Robert E. Lee's second son, was shot in the thigh and carried from the field. earlier.


